INDIA ITME 2012 - Post Event Report

The ITME Society, a non profit exhibition body established in 1980 promotes and serves the textile and textile engineering industry through holding textile technology exhibitions every 4 year. The 9th edition of India International Textile Machinery Exhibition was held from 2nd to 7th Dec 2012 at Bombay Convention & Exhibition Centre.

India ITME 2012 concluded successfully and was by far the largest and most successful, upholding the trend of continued growth of the event since its inception in 1980.

With 848 exhibitors from 32 countries, covering over 100,000 sqm. of exhibition area, 7 new country participation, delegation and visitors from 61 foreign countries, this edition was the largest so far India has ever hosted with the complete exhibition space of Bombay Convention & Exhibition Centre booked from mid-November 2012 to December 10, 2012. 375 companies (263- Indian, 112-Foreign) were waitlisted for lack of space. All in all it was a good networking platform for media, technocrats, consultants, government officials, exhibitors and business visitors.

Apart from the exhibition halls, a separate conference & meeting area was created, popularly known as "ITME Square" which housed VIP lounge, media lounge, seminar hall, meeting rooms of various capacity and ITME booth.



For first time ITME Society also exhibited and had a custom-made booth selling catalogues/promoting the Society and also to handle enquiries/assistance.

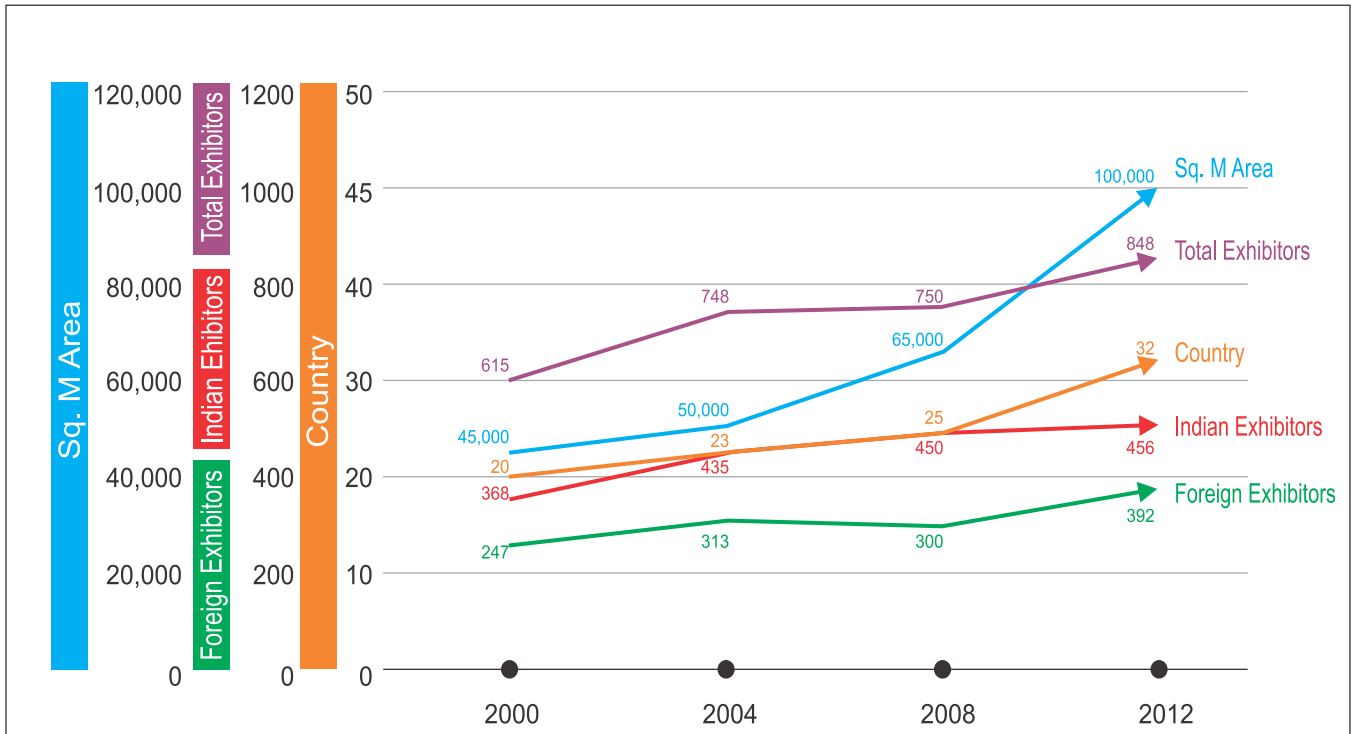


Observation & Trends during India ITME 2012 :

Traffic management both inside and outside the venue was given attention and state traffic police was engaged to manage peak traffic flow outside venue from Jaycoach junction to Goregaon station. India ITME Society even repaired public road to ensure free flow of vehicle movement. As SRPF grounds were not available for hire this time, we booked IT parking with 600 carpark slots to provide parking facility to visitors and exhibitors.

Shuttle buses were arranged every 15 minutes from Goregaon station to venue and back for convenience of visitors.

Airport counters were put up at both domestic and international terminals for the convenience of participants and visitors.

Visitor guides were printed for convenience of visitors along with 7 help desks with staff at various locations in the venue.

Scenic landscaping with fountains and benches to sit were created at the venue to give visual treat and comfort for participants at the exhibition.



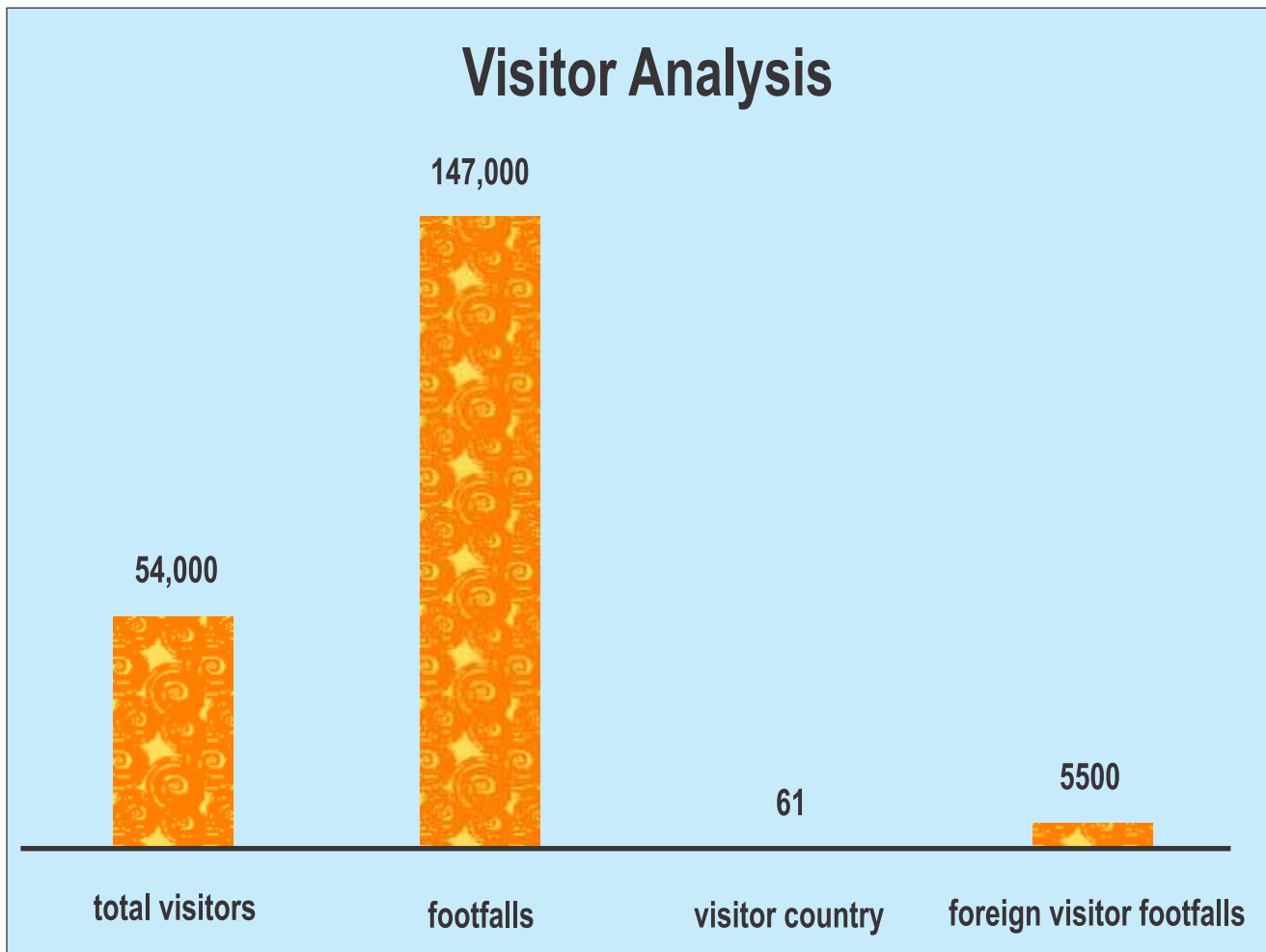

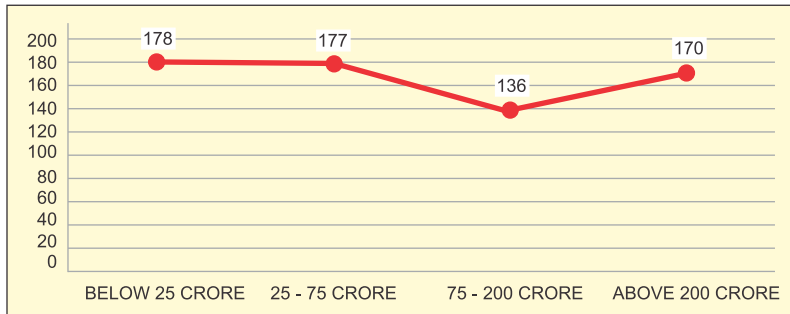

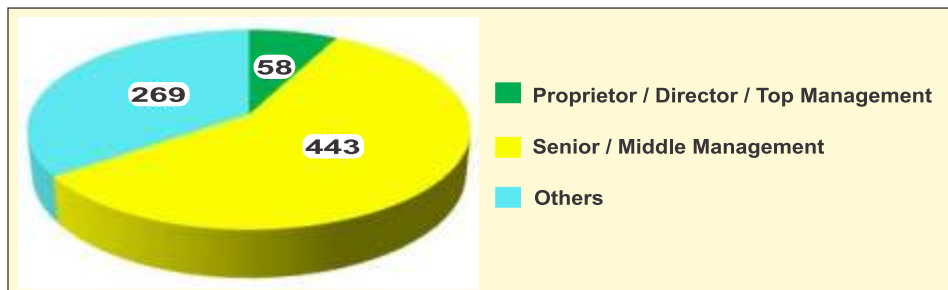

We put efforts to ensure better networking and interaction between visitors and foreign delegates and proper planning of visitors time spent at exhibition ground. We even organized factory visits for foreign delegates and meeting with government officials and industry associates. A total of 1241 meetings were arranged for exhibitors and foreign delegates. Out of 848 exhibitors 400 exhibitors utilized the said facility.

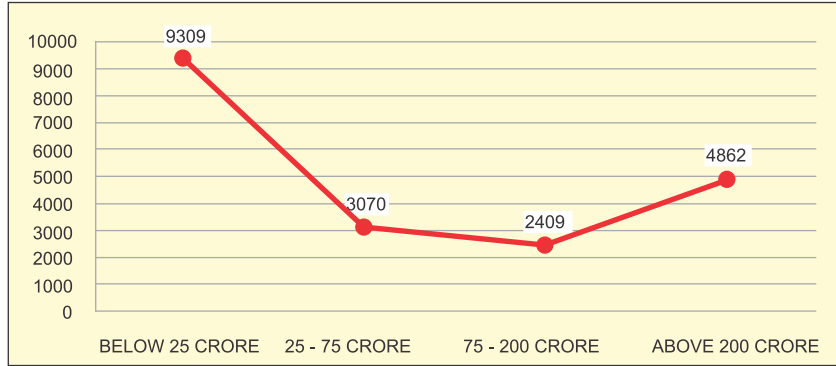




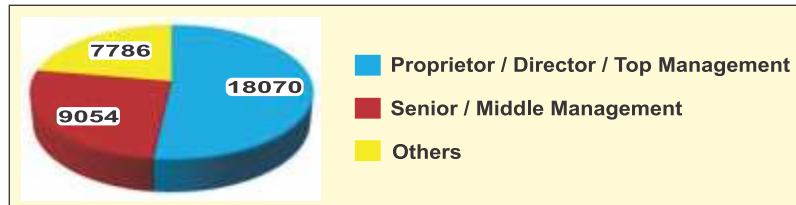

This is for the first time we have participated in an Indian show and the response has been very good. We got a lot of enquiries but don't know how many of them will get converted into orders.

Our product range is completely for finishing woven fabrics. Price wise we are very competitive but are getting tough competition because of the existence of local manufacturers in this field. We export our machines to Germany, Belarus, Poland and other major countries in Europe. Compared to European our machinery price is less.

In Turkey textile technology manufactures are upgrading their quality level and are exporting to very high class European companies. India is also a very important market for us. Textile companies here are realising the importance of installing hi-tech technologies in their factories for increasing productivity. In future, Turkey will be playing a major role in supplying quality machines to the Indian market.

We have displayed high speed circular machine and flat knitting machine. The Tirupur industry is suffering due to labour and power problems. In spite of getting orders they are unable to make timely delivery. Besides, ETP is also a major issue that has affected the Tirupur industry a lot.

In past, Indian knitters were mostly making casual wear, then they switched to casual sportswear and now we have brought our new technology purely for sportswear or for functional textiles. Functional textiles are already used by major sports wear brands like Nike, Adidas etc. The first machine is already sold and will be installed soon in Ludhiana. The sportswear segment is growing in a big way in India.

We installed our first flat knitting machine in Ludhiana in 2009. Now the flat knitting segment is growing in India. We are having different agents for different regions of the country. Our company is performing well in India, especially in Kolkata, where we sold good number of machines last year. I think 2013 might be the period for the Indian textile industry to jump onto the next level. We are expecting it to be a very important market for Pai Lung in future.

This is for the first time we are participating in this show. For last three years we are selling Turkish machines to India. We have already sold a few knit finishing machines here. The current market scenario is good. In terms of organisation, the 2012 edition of India ITME is much better than the last one. We met many new customers here. With the rising problems in Arabian countries, Pakistan and due to some other issues in Bangladesh, people are now investing in India. Market is growing here and people are ready to invest in new technologies. Turkish companies have maintained particular standard when it comes to manufacturing quality machines. These manufacturers give minimum two years guarantee on their machines. When compared to European machines our machines are almost 30-40 per cent cheaper. We pay a lot of importance to after-sales-service. We make enough spare parts available and have trained service engineers. Technology wise we are at par with Europeans but due to low manufacturing cost we have advantage in terms of price over them.

We regularly participate in all India ITME shows. The attendance was very good in this edition and we got so many enquiries here. There is a huge demand for our machines in Indian market especially from Southern Indian markets like Chennai and Tirupur. We are just exchanging our technological knowhow with the Indian manufacturers. In this regard, we are updating their technicians through exhibitions, which are very helpful in doing the same. We have installed almost 450 machines in last five years in India.

We make 24 types of machinery for the knitting industry and we are very good in dyeing and finishing. We have our own dye house and having experienced as a user, as well as a manufacturer of these machines in Turkey. So, we very well understand the end user's requirements and all our machines are user-friendly. We offer complete solution for establishing a dye house. Price wise also we are 20-30 per cent cheaper than European brands. Currently, Brazil, India, Indonesia, China, Bangladesh are the biggest markets for us.

Relocating the show to Mumbai was a good decision. Response has been much better than last edition. This venue is more convenient than previous issue. We met so many customers not only from India but from Bangladesh and Sri Lanka as well. We were very much surprised to see such number of customers from Bangladesh here. Bangladesh has an advantage of having low labour cost over India. We are concentrating on the Indian market and have our own sales and service team here. India is going to be a very important sourcing destination for buyers from Europe. With more companies coming and putting up their manufacturing facilities here and India's increasing ability to meet quality standards imposed by international buyers, the country is becoming one of the most potential sourcing destinations for buyers overseas. In the beginning of the year was little bit slow but now things have started improving. We think 2013 will definitely be better than 2012.

It was a good decision to organise this show in Mumbai after eight years. No. of visitors and exhibitors is much better compared to last edition in Bangalore. I think it is the best ITME ever. We had visitors not only from India but from neighbouring countries like Bangladesh, Sri Lanka, Iran etc. so the response has been fantastic. We are displaying here a new concept where screen +digital are done in one single process from M&R and Kornit. Until now there were separate digital and screen printing technologies, with their own advantages and disadvantages.

We have already installed one digital printing machine in Tirupur and one more will be installed soon. Though this technology and concept were there always but only problem digital had is its speed which is slower than conventional. When screen prints 400-500 pieces per hr at the same time digital prints 70-80 pieces per hr, slowing down whole screen printing process was not viable. Three months before we introduced a new model in digital, which is three times faster. Now it can print 250 pieces per hr. so it is very much viable as it is not slowing down the screen print machine. In screen printing machine quality of the screen is very much important. So this new concept brings two different technologies together on one platform. We also have digital machine from d.gen Korea. It's the only company in the world that offers lifetime warrantee.
